

3rd International Symposium on Crime Studies

The Centre for Criminology and Forensic Studies (CCFS), Jindal Institute of Behavioural Sciences (JIBS) organised the 3rd International Symposium on Crime Studies on 1st and 2nd April 2023 at the O.P. Jindal Global University (JGU) campus in Sonipat, Haryana. CCFS was founded in 2020 to direct more focused efforts in research and pedagogy towards integrating forensic science and criminology into legal education and practice. The Centre fosters interdisciplinarity in allied disciplines such as forensic science, law, criminology, and legal psychology, with the focus on models that assist the criminal justice mechanisms in regional and international regimes. CCFS aims to identify the lacunas and limitation in current criminal justice systems and bring forth innovative and futuristic legislation and policy making in reforming the issues at various levels.

The International Symposium on Crime Studies (1 & 2 April 2023) was the third international event organized by the Centre of Criminology and Forensic Studies at Jindal Institute of Behavioural Sciences, O. P. Jindal Global University. Renowned experts in fields of criminology, forensics and related crime studies were invited to discuss new research and insights on emerging crime phenomena, technological advances in Crime Studies and Criminal Justice System. The symposium also included, panel discussion, paper presentation, poster presentation and case study competition.

The Conference was in partnership with Association of Certified Financial Crime Specialist- India Chapter and Indian Society of Criminology. It was inaugurated in the august presence of Prof. (Dr.) Sanjeev P. Sahni (Principal Director, JIBS and Vice President, World Society of Victimology); Professor Mark Button, Professor of Criminology, University of Portsmouth; Dr. Vasileios Karagiannopoulos, Reader in Cybercrime and cyber security, University of Portsmouth; Dr. Chloe Hawkins, Senior Lecturer, University of Portsmouth; Dr. Paul Gilmour, Lecturer, University of Portsmouth, and many other panellists.

The two-day conference, in its 3rd edition deliberated on the multiple issues around Cybersecurity, Financial Crime Studies, Environmental Crime, Role of Forensic Science in CJS, Cyber Criminology Crime Scene Investigation, Criminal Justice Systems: Reform and Practices, Neuro-Criminology, Advances in Criminological Research, Forensic Psychology in Criminal Justice System. Forty papers were presented by eminent criminologist and Psychological Studies' Scholars from across the globe. Over 100 delegates from different Universities over various countries participated in this knowledge-sharing forum.
